# **CRITERION I – CURRICULAR ASPECTS**

#### 1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

The Institution follows a course curriculum prescribed and approved by the apex bodies. The Heads of the Departments continuously monitor and work on the enrichment in the curriculum, based on inputs from feedback obtained from staff and students. The necessary changes / improvements are communicated to the Board of Studies members through the Principal. Representatives from the college regularly participate in the Board of Studies meeting of the University. Any revision in the curriculum advised by the DCI and/ or RGUHS is discussed and implemented. The curriculum design and development meet all the requirements. For community needs, both undergraduate and postgraduate students are trained to develop cognitive skills by regularly training to treat the patients. The knowledge is implemented in an uncompromised ethical way to treat patients who come to the Institution and also by students and staff offering their free services at various community based programs like dental camps. Blood donation camps are organized at regular intervals a part of Youth Red Cross program. Camps are arranged to educate and motivate the general public to prevent and treat oral diseases at an early stage. Mobile Dental Unit is used

to provide dental services to the rural population .For Professional skills and competencies, Curriculum includes clinical postings for undergraduate and post graduate students. Students are trained in pre-clinical and clinical procedures. The pre-clinical procedures include training on models, casts mannequins (phantom heads). Clinical training includes demonstrations, discussions of the clinical cases and treating patients under the guidance of the faculty. Exposure to new technologies / modern equipments / techniques / procedures through CDE programs and demonstrations to faculty and students. Compulsory rotatory internship in all the departments is also mandatory along with compulsory rural postings. For research in thrust/emerging areas, as part of the curriculum endorsed by Dental Council of India and RGUHS, students enrolled in the Master of Dental Surgery program must undertake and complete a research project in the form of dissertation for partial fulfillment of their Master's Degree. The dissertation and short research studies conducted in our Institution are based on current scientific debates and discussions, as well as those that translate to benefit the patient in diagnosis and treatment. Staff members are encouraged to pursue research activities. Small projects are undertaken by the undergraduate students in their internship year which are based on the health needs of the local population. For Innovations, In addition to teaching new thrust areas and emerging specialties, the teaching includes coverage of continual developments and latest trends immaterial science, and long established therapeutic procedures. Innovative ideas from the students are encouraged by allowing them to participate in state level and national level conference. Career guidance classes are conducted for the house surgeons. With regard to employability, the students are trained in such a manner that they are competent enough to establish and run their private practice and apply for any job. Students are encouraged to think differently and be innovative in their approach.

The periodical review meeting is conducted to review the following: IQAC organizes various Faculty Development Programmes in order to enrich the competency level and teaching methods of faculty members. The college encourages the faculty members to pursue higher education, contributing to various academic books, and publishing papers in journals. The management supports to conducts seminars/symposia and workshops in every academic year. It is through these programmes we bring out new implications. Apart from this,

college supports student involvement through seminars, student's innovations for the further development of curriculum. After collecting and assessing the feedback from the various stake holders on curriculum aspects, the valuable suggestions if any, will make notice to the university curriculum committee to possible changes in the course structure for the next curriculum regulation. The College follows a continuous review system of the curriculum. The College established an IQAC as a Quality sustenance and Quality enhancement measure. The IQAC has been infusing a sense of belongingness into the entire teaching faculty of the Institution. The functioning of various committees of the College strengthens the quality sustenance and enhancement measures to ensure the effective development of curricula. The college makes efforts to integrate socially relevant issues into the curriculum with the help of the different cells functioning in the college like Career Guidance Cell, AntiRagging Cell and NSS. IQAC has been organizing Faculty Development Program every year to enhance the professional competency and teaching pedagogy of the faculty. Curriculum is enriched through mini projects/ student conferences/symposiums and innovative club in the college. Students are also introduced to dentistry as a profession that requires not only technological skills but also an ethical orientation, of the need for lifelong learning, and of the importance of Basic Sciences and Humanities courses. The Institution would like to include the following Curriculum Aspects which enrich the curriculum: 1. Value added courses. 2. Design experiments in many research areas thereby stimulating creativity and innovation in students.

Procedures and policies for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc. The college has modern infrastructure and latest equipment for the needs of students and staff. The facilities will be updated every year as per the need basis. There are various committees which will look after the maintenance and utilization of physical, academic and support facilities. Laboratory: Laboratories are used by undergraduate students and post graduate students. Lab incharge staff and Head of the department take care of the labs. All the research activities by the students and staff will be done in the labs including central research lab after taking permission from concerned staff. Library and computers: Navodaya Central Library is fully automated with the EasyLib management software. Library will be open from 9.00 am to 11.00 pm. Library has 24 hours studying room with discussion cubicles and hygienic cafeteria. Every year latest editions of books, journals and computer systems will be procured after seeking approval from management through Library committee. User can search the books by Author, Title, Subject and keywords using OPAC kiosk. Also the users can know the latest editions of periodicals, books and the status of the books and journals. Library will be issuing 02 books to UG students for 7 days, 04 books including journals to PG students for 15 days and 05 books to faculties for 90 days. At the end of due date they can renew the books. To enter the Digital Library and to access electronic resource provided by RGUHS HELINET consortium students and faculty have to enter the user details in the Log book. Central Library is providing free wifi service. Library is also having three audio visual rooms (conference halls) of three different seating capacity which can be used after taking permission from Registrar, NET. Library provides 20 systems for RGUHS digital evaluation. Computer maintenance will be done by system admin once in a month. Sports complex: The campus has outdoor sports facilities like basketball ground, volleyball ground, throwball ground, football ground, cricket ground, 400 meter standard track and indoor sports facilities like table tennis, chess, carom, boy's gym, girl's gym which can be used by students and staff of Navodaya dental college. Physical education director is in charge for department of sports and these facilities can be used after taking his permission. Physical education director takes the permission from Principal to conduct RGUHS tournaments. Indoor and outdoor sports competition will be conducted during the annual day celebration. Classrooms: All the classrooms have LCD projectors. The classrooms are utilized by the staff and students. For any requirements, head of the department submits a letter to Principal. Cleaning and maintenance will be done by nonteaching staff.

Practice 1 Title of the practice: Curriculum details display over the website Objectives: Utilisation of college website for display of timetables, exam schedules and question papers of previous university examinations and internal assessment examinations Context: This practice was adopted to improve the accessibility of university and internal assessment question papers through the display over the website. This can help the students to improve the performance in their examinations. Practice 2 Title of the practice: Special cases display Objectives: Display of special cases with treatment protocol followed, on the respective department notice boards Context: This practice is adopted to improve the awareness of different procedures followed in the department apart from the routine procedures followed in each department for the patients as well as for the undergraduate students. Practice: Whenever there is a special case in the department, photographs at various levels like, before initiation of the treatment, during the treatment and after the treatment and during followup are displayed in the department notice boards along with diagnostic aids like radiographs and histopathology pictures in relevant cases. Along with the photographs a description of the clinical and diagnostic details and treatment protocol followed are also displayed.
