Practice 1

Title of the practice: Curriculum details display over the website

Objectives: Utilisation of college website for display of timetables, exam schedules and question papers of previous university examinations and internal assessment examinations

Context: This practice was adopted to improve the accessibility of university and internal assessment question papers through the display over the website. This can help the students to improve the performance in their examinations. Practice 2

Title of the practice: Special cases display

Objectives: Display of special cases with treatment protocol followed, on the respective department notice boards

Context: This practice is adopted to improve the awareness of different procedures followed in the department apart from the routine procedures followed in each department for the patients as well as for the undergraduate students.

Practice: Whenever there is a special case in the department, photographs at various levels like, before initiation of the treatment, during the treatment and after the treatment and during follow-up are displayed in the department notice boards along with diagnostic aids like radiographs and histopathology pictures in relevant cases. Along with the photographs a description of the clinical and diagnostic details and treatment protocol followed are also displayed. Evidence of success: This practice has improved the interest of undergraduate students to learn about the various special cases and their interest in pursuing post-graduation has also increased. Patient awareness has also increased by the display of these special cases.
